# 3/40 Class Assembly - Friday, 21st June

Parents of children in 3/40 are warmly invited to their class assembly at 9:10am on Friday, 21<sup>st</sup> June in the Main Hall. After the assembly, refreshments will be served and then you are welcome to stay until morning playtime to join the children for a learning experience in their classroom.

#### Class Structure 2019 - 2020

We have had 42 children apply to join us as a first choice preference for FS2 in September and the vast majority of these have accepted their places. We will have a predicted total of 292 children on roll in September. As you are already aware, we will be running 11 classes in September as opposed to 10 classes which, with this total, the Local Authority would suggest we should. This is due to careful budgeting and planning going forward. However, as I have also already said, unless school budgets increase or our numbers go up significantly, we will be running 10 classes in the year 2020-2021.

The school structure for September will be as follows:

As you can imagine, a lot of thought and time with Leadership, governors and teaching staff goes in to determining this structure. We have carefully considered the pros and cons of various structures in detail. We wanted to avoid a 'few' children from a year group going in to classes with a different make up from their peers. We wanted, as much as possible, for children to have equal class sizes so that they had a similar teacher: pupil ratio across the school. We are also mindful of the legislation that states that Key stage 1 classes must be less than 30 at the start of the year.

We have some logistical arrangements to sort out with the 2/3 mix with regards to start and finish times and which classrooms we will use but these are all in hand and I will write to parents in these year groups once they are finalised. We still have 6 weeks of this term before the end of this academic year. As a start though, there are no SATs in Year 2 next academic year (these will no longer be happening nationally) and Year 2 will still have the main parts in our Christmas nativity.

We are committed to making this work for all the children and to maintaining as many classes as financially possible going forward next year, subject to funding and numbers.





### Sports day - TOMORROW...we hope!





We have been following the weather forecast avidly for tomorrow all week. If there is any way that Sports Day can take place, it will run (no pun intended). This includes if we can only partially run it for either the Lower or Upper School if the weather changes during the day.

Sports day will be cancelled if it is raining or if the grass is too wet for the running races and therefore, dangerous. If the weather means that we have to cancel, a decision will be made as early as possible and a text message will be sent out via our parentmail service. If you do not receive a text message, please **do not** call the office as the event will be on!

In order for it to run as smoothly as possible, here are some reminders for us all:

- <u>Lower school Sports Morning</u> runs from 9.30am 11.30am

  Parents can follow the carousel of sports action around the outside of the events.
- <u>Upper school Sports Afternoon</u> runs from 1.00pm-3.00pm

  Parents to sit on the far side of the track please. The children will sit in their House Team on the school side of the track and will be supervised by staff. Please can parents NOT cross the track. Access to the field is across the middle playground only for the afternoon.
- We recommend that you bring a chair or a picnic blanket to sit on.
- <u>CHILDREN ARE ENCOURAGED TO WEAR HOUSE COLOURS TO SCHOOL TOMORROW AND REMINDED TO BRING A WATER BOTTLE AND HAT AS WELL AS WEAR SUN CREAM.</u>
- The whole of the school site, including the field, is no smoking/vaping and no dogs are allowed on site.
- Following the presentations at the end of the afternoon, Upper school children are free to go with their parents providing they have a parent present. Those children who do not have a parent present will be dismissed from school in the normal way by their class teacher.
- Children in the Lower school will be dismissed by their class teacher as normal. If you are on your way up from the field, don't worry we will look after any siblings until we see you.
