Welcome back to Term 2. I hope that you had a lovely half term, despite the weather!



As you are aware, we have headed in to a second lockdown period today. The DfE has updated its guidance for schools in light of this and this was published after school yesterday. Much of the existing guidance remains the same and, operationally, there will be no differences for our school in terms of classes working in bubbles. We are unable to hold whole school events, such as assemblies and so will continue to do these virtually. Handwashing remains very important and is a regular and well-practised part of our routine now. We continue to teach PE and Music in a safe way by adapting the curriculum so that PE will take place outside where possible and within the guidance when we are in the hall. Sadly, we are unable to run after school clubs this term and are not allowed to arrange sports fixtures with other schools during this time. Also sadly, we cannot sing together but we have again found a way to have 'non singing' time in class – just ask your children!

As a Primary school, pupils will not be expected to wear masks. Staff will not wear masks when teaching but there may be occasions where staff members wear them in the corridors or communal areas or at drop off and pick up times. As currently, please can only one person come to collect your child(ren) when possible and please always maintain social distancing. We appreciate that it will take longer to dismiss the children and thank you for supporting us with this. Face masks should be worn by parents and carers if you are unable to socially distance or you come inside the school building.

I am very relieved that our school remains open and fully appreciate our role in this challenging time. I know that a second period of lockdown, for some of our community, brings extra anxieties and personal upset. As always, we are here to help and support in any way we can.
