Class Dojo and Home Learning

It has been brilliant to see so many children engaged in this so far - well done!



Here are a few points / reminders:

- Class teachers will be able to respond to any queries on Class Dojo during the school day PLEASE
 DO SPEAK TO THEM they will be very bored without you!
- Home learning will include some direct teaching. This could include videos on Class Dojo from the
 class teacher or links to clips online eg from Oak Academy or BBC Bitesize. This will often be prerecorded so that children can access it at different times (which can help with sharing devices).
- Class teachers are monitoring engagement. Please upload any home learning for feedback on to your child's portfolio (or via messenger if portfolio won't work) on Class Dojo so that they can see it. I am also having a look at work each day! Where we can't see children's engagement, we will be following up with parents, in line with DfE guidelines.
- Digital devices from the DfE have NOT been released to primary schools yet and we have not been allocated many. Where parents need paper copies, please let your child's class teacher know.

Staffing Update

We are delighted to welcome Mr Cliff to our teaching team. Mr Cliff is teaching 6J. What a start he has had! It is great to have him on board.

We are also pleased to say that Mr Ball has taken up the position of Upper School Leader from the start of this term and has joined the leadership team within school.

Collective Worship and Class Celebration Zooms

We will continue to share in Collective Worship each week. Since the end of March, this has been recorded and shared remotely or in classrooms. It will continue this way and will be based around our value for the term.

In addition, since September, we have thoroughly enjoyed Celebration Zoom time each week, where we have virtually joined together as a whole school. I think that it might be a little ambitious to try this as a whole school but each class teacher will be looking to hold a class Celebration Zoom, possibly once a fortnight, where children can join together with their class mates.

We are aware that some families are sharing devices so we would look to publish a timetable for these so that there are no clashes. This will be shared on Class Dojo.

Free School Meals and Universal Infant Free School Meals

Vulnerable children and children of critical workers who are in school and who are entitled to a FSM or a UIFSM will be able to order a meal in the usual way. Our kitchens are open.

There is no provision for UIFSM children who are not in school.

Families of children who are entitled to FSM who aren't in school are able to collect a food hamper provided by Dolce every fortnight. The DfE has instructed that kitchens must stay open in schools and therefore there will be no vouchers issued during this period of lockdown as the provision is still in place. Families who are entitled to this have been contacted. The hampers meet all the necessary standards and food and items in the hampers cannot be substituted. If a child is not keen on some of the food, then the thinking is that someone else in the house can enjoy that and the money saved can be spent on what the child would like instead.

Where a child is attending school part-time, there will be a balance of meals in school and hampers.
