On **Friday**, 23<sup>rd</sup> **September**, children are allowed to wear denim (or their own clothes) rather than uniform in exchange for a donation for this charity.

#### 10p Toast

10p Toast will start on Monday, 12<sup>th</sup> September for children in Year 1-6 and for Reception on Monday, 19<sup>th</sup> September.

The children can collect their toast (buttered or unbuttered – range of white, brown and wholemeal bread) from either hall as they arrive in school in the morning. Toast is only served until 8:50am and so therefore only available for children who arrive on time.



Toast can either be pre-paid for via parentmail, a term in advance, or children can bring in 50p on a Monday or 10p each day. Where toast is pre-paid, or 50p is brought in at the start of the week, there are no refunds if a child is not in school or does not want toast.

Children who are entitled to pupil premium can have toast for free; their names are automatically added to the pre-paid list.

#### Attendance and Punctuality

The start of a new school year is always a great time to remind everyone about the importance of good attendance and arriving in school on time. Remember, that the doors open from 8:45am-8:50am off either the bottom or middle playground and the children start personalised learning from the moment they get to their classrooms as part of their I-learn time.

If your child is unwell, please telephone the school from 8am to inform us. If we do not hear from you, we operate a first day calling system to ensure that you are aware that they aren't in school and to find out the reason for their absence. All absences will need a written note for our records which are also scrutinised by the Education Welfare Officer.

Government targets for attendance are 97% for every pupil. Those children with less than 90% attendance are considered persistent absentees, <u>even if the reason for absence is authorised</u>.

#### Clubs

Over the next week, you will receive information about clubs that the staff will be offering this term. As always, thank you to staff who offer to run these.

Clubs will run from 26<sup>th</sup> September - 2<sup>nd</sup> December.

The only opportunity to sign up to a club will be as this information comes out via parentmail. Children will not be permitted to join clubs at a later date as this can cause confusion about attendance (and therefore safeguarding) in the office. If a child is signed up to a club it is the expectation that they attend that club if they have attended school that day.

## **Collective Worship and Assemblies**

We meet as a whole school for worship on Mondays, in the school hall. This worship is based around our value for each term and / or the Christian calendar. On a Tuesday, we meet either as a lower school or upper school for singing worship.

Every Wednesday, the 'Open the Book' team - a team of volunteers from the churches in Cricklade - come and deliver productions of Bible stories to the school. These are popular, interactive sessions with lots of audience participation!

On a Thursday, there is class led worship. Often a challenge or an idea for following up Monday's worship is set.

At the end of the week, we meet as a whole school for Celebration Assembly. This is exactly as it is named - a chance to celebrate success, achievement and effort across the school. Sometimes an individual, or a class will bring in work to share or show. There are plus point certificates and other rewards given out. In addition, each class teacher will choose two stars of the week and share the reason they have been chosen. Their names (and reasons) are added to the board outside my office and the children can wear a 'Star of the Week' badge for the week.

We also like to celebrate successes and achievements outside school. If your child has a certificate or trophy or similar that they would like to share, they are welcome to bring it to school on a Friday.
