The <u>Wiltshire 3 Peaks Challenge</u> is a fantastic opportunity to inspire individuals and families to get outside and active, to support vulnerable young lives, as well as enjoy a fun and rewarding experience in the beautiful Wiltshire countryside. All the money raised from the challenge goes to support an amazing Wiltshire-based children's charity, the <u>Youth Adventure Trust</u>.

Enjoy a family adventure this summer and help change young lives!

The Wiltshire 3 Peaks Challenge is on Saturday 17th June - walk, jog or run 10km or a half marathon in the beautiful Pewsey Vale.

Family tickets for 2 adults, 2 children or 1 adult, 3 children:

- 10k route: £35 entry fee plus £150 fundraising target
- Half marathon: £70 entry fee plus £300 fundraising target

The Challenge HQ is at Oare Village Hall, near Marlborough, finishers get a bespoke medal and there will be refreshments and cakes at the end. Individual tickets are available, and well-behaved dogs on a lead are welcome too.
