Sports Week 2023 - 12th - 16th June 2023

SPORTSWEEK is back! We are on the countdown for Monday 12th June when Lizzy Yarnold (double Olympic Gold Medalist) will be visiting. We will have a go at Archery, Cycling, Cricket, Volleyball, Wheelchair Basketball, Fencing, Bowls, Dance and the usual Speed Stacks and Sports Day itself on Friday 16th June. This year's theme is P L A Y, PLAY for FUN, PLAY for fitness, PLAY for wellbeing, P L A Y 460. The chief medical office for England recommends ALL children should be active for a minimum of 60 minutes per day. Any heart raising activity will be counted towards the daily 60 minutes. Walking or wheels to school, PE lessons, lunchtimes and after school clubs can all count towards the 60. Outside of school we encourage all families to walk, cycle, take part in sports and social clubs, swim, run, and generally PLAY to get the vital minimum 60 minutes a day. Please help embrace out P L A Y 4 60 focus this year by following our twitter feed and sending in your comments and examples of being active outside of school.

Children need to wear the <u>correct</u> school PE kit all week. Please note that if children do not wear the correct school PE kit in school, they may not be able to participate in some of the exciting activities. The children will also need a named water bottle, a named hat and sun cream applied please.

Correct school PE kit is black or green shorts, a plain white T-shirt, sports socks and trainers / daps. Children can wear their school sweatshirt.

ON FRIDAY, 16th JUNE, WE ENCOURAGE CHILDREN TO WEAR THEIR HOUSE COLOURS FOR OUR "SPORTS DAY".

If you are unsure what 'House' you child is in, please speak with your child's class teacher.
